

## Earning college credit during high school

### Advanced Opportunities Program

- Idaho's Advanced Opportunities (AO) Program allocates \$4,625 to every student.
- AO funds can be used to pay for dual credit classes which allow students to earn college credit while also earning high school credit. AO funds can also pay for many courses taken directly from Idaho colleges during high school.



### Dual Credit (DC) - Three Options

1. IDVA offers many dual credit (also called concurrent credit) courses - look in the IDVA course catalog [HERE](#) for courses marked with a plus sign (+).
2. IDLA is a separate online platform that many public schools in Idaho use. IDLA offers lots of DC courses. Ask your counselor for a list of IDLA courses.
3. On campus - students can register directly with Idaho colleges to take courses - check with your counselor about this option.

- Students must qualify to take dual credit courses by maintaining the required minimum GPA of the college they are earning credit through. A 3.0 cumulative GPA is recommended, but not always required.
